Job Description

The New York City Department of Corrections (DOC) is one of the largest municipal jail systems in the United States. It provides for the care, custody, and control of persons accused of crimes or convicted and sentenced to one-year or less of jail time. The DOC operates 15 inmate facilities, ten of which are located on Rikers Island. In addition, the department operates two hospital prison wards (Bellevue and Elmhurst hospitals) and court holding facilities in Criminal, Supreme, and Family Court in each borough. The DOC is seeking a trades person who's task will include but are not limited to the following:

- Lays bricks or masonry units for walls and partitions within DOC facilities.
- Works with refractory and insulating unit for boiler settings and combustion chambers.
- Does fireproofing, block arching, terra cotta cutting and setting.
- Constructs brick masonry sewers and manholes.
- Provides estimates on materials required for small jobs.
- Performs other duties/special projects as assigned.

Qualification Requirements

1. Five years of full-time satisfactory experience as a bricklayer; or
2. At least three years of experience as described in "1" above and sufficient bricklayer apprentice experience or training in the bricklaying filed acquired in an approved trade, technical or vocational high school to make up the equivalent of the remaining required experience. Six months of acceptable experience will be credited for each year of the above apprentice experience or training.

For appointment to certain positions, at least six months of experience working on a two-point suspension scaffold on high rise buildings may be required.

Residency Requirements

New York City residency is generally required within 90 days of appointment. However, City employees in certain titles who have worked for the City for 2 continuous years may also be eligible to reside in Nassau, Suffolk, Putnam, Westchester, Rockland, or Orange County. To determine if the residency requirement applies to you, please discuss with the agency representative at the time of interview.
