



Ten Years After 9/11: A Check-Up For Our Children

9/11 Environmental Action and pediatric specialists from the **World Trade Center Environmental Health Center at Bellevue Hospital** invite you to a forum with an important update on where we stand on treating the health effects of 9/11.

Symptoms, diagnosis and treatment as well as options for care available to downtown children as part of the James Zadroga 9/11 Health and Compensation Act will be discussed. Children who resided or went to school in lower Manhattan on 9/11 and children of rescue and recovery workers may be eligible for care. The pediatric program at the Environmental Health Center is for children under age 18. Young adults over 18 may be eligible for the adult program.
