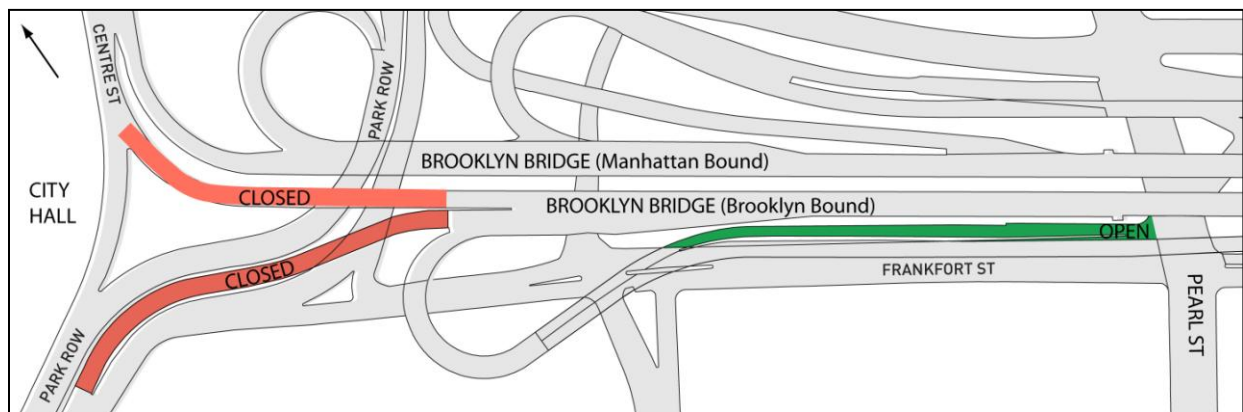
Rehabilitation of the Brooklyn Bridge

October 2010

CB 1 and 3 (Manhattan) and CB 2 (Brooklyn)

The New York City Department of Transportation is currently performing rehabilitation work on the Brooklyn Bridge ramps and approaches, which are in urgent need of repair. This work began in the spring of 2010 and continues until 2014.

On Monday Nov 1st, beginning at 1:00 am until 6:00 am work will resume on two entrance ramps to the eastbound/outbound Brooklyn Bridge in Manhattan, displayed in **red** below:

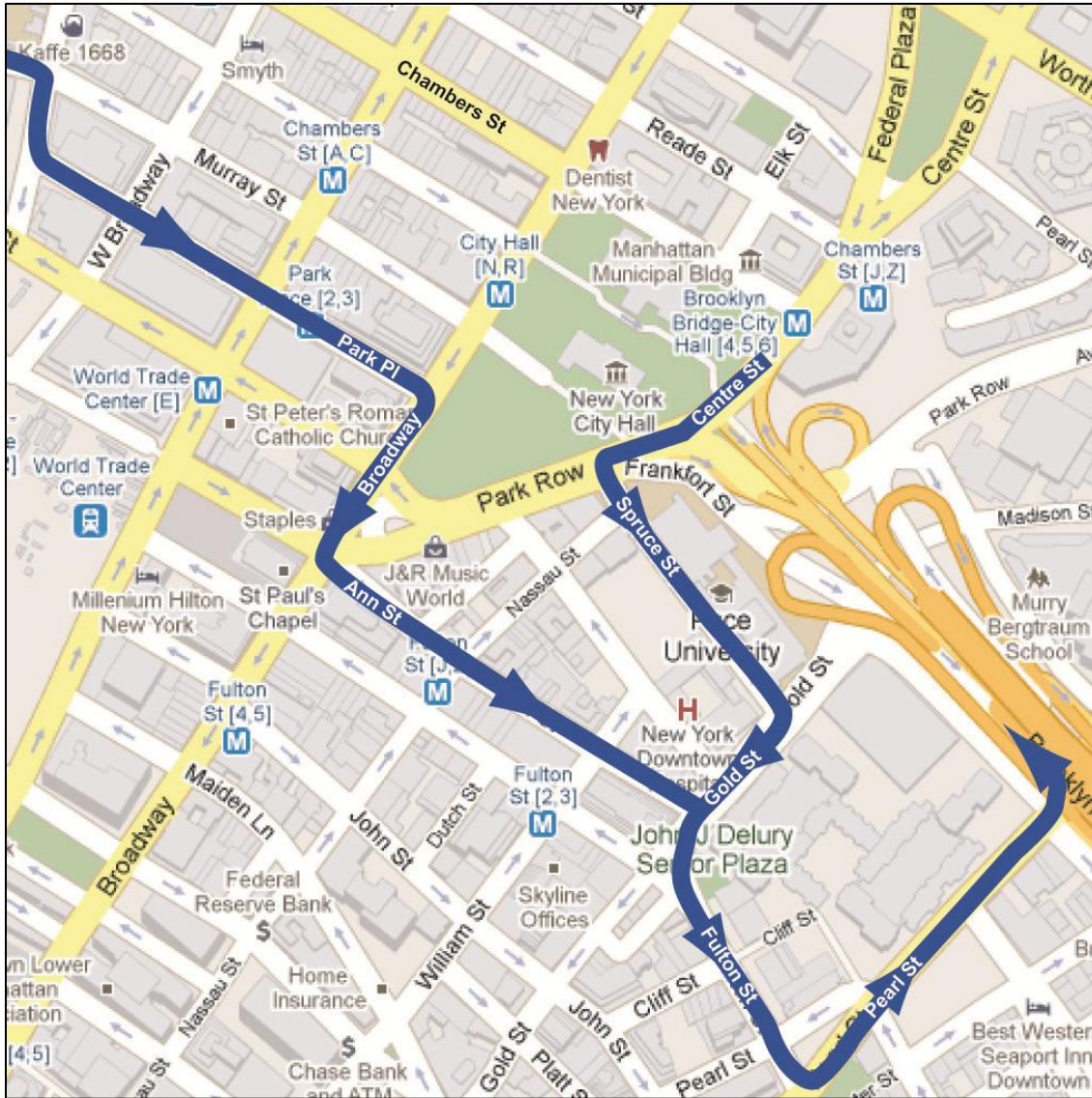


These ramps will be closed Mondays through Saturdays from 1:00 am to 6:00 am, for approximately three weeks. All traffic heading to Brooklyn will be detoured to Pearl Street, as shown on the map on the following page:

- From the West Side Highway: Take the Murray Street exit and turn right on Greenwich Street. Turn left onto Park Place and right onto Broadway. Make a left onto Ann Street. Turn right on Gold Street, left on Fulton Street, and left onto Pearl Street to access the on-ramp to the Brooklyn Bridge.
- From Centre Street: Continue south down Park Row and turn left onto Spruce Street and right onto Gold Street, and then follow the same route as the West Side Highway detour described above.

Signage and traffic agents will guide these detours, and Brooklyn-bound traffic will remain on the south roadway in a single lane into Brooklyn. **The “contraflow”, or routing of Brooklyn-bound traffic along the north roadway, is not expected to resume until 2011.**
