

What is the Brooklyn Waterfront Greenway?

The Brooklyn Waterfront Greenway is a planned north - south 14-mile multi-use path, stretching from Newtown Creek to Owl's Head Park. The project will increase access to the waterfront, improve pedestrian and bicycle safety, and connect the numerous public open spaces along the waterfront.

- Create pedestrian and bicycle paths that can be used for people of all ages and cycling abilities.
- Increase public health benefits.
- Create a greener city.
- Increase green space and create a stronger physical connection between our streets, the natural environment and the waterfront.
- Encourage a modal shift in commuting patterns.
