Brooklyn Bridge Rehabilitation

Southbound FDR Drive Ramp Weekend Access Restriction October 28 – October 31

The New York City Department of Transportation is currently rehabilitating the Brooklyn Bridge. Work started in 2010 and will continue until 2014. A portion of the **southbound FDR Drive ramp onto the Brooklyn-bound roadway will be closed for a full weekend** (see below) to facilitate roadway replacement. Brooklyn-bound traffic will continue to Brooklyn using a detour through local streets to the existing Pearl Street ramp (see following page). This is the only anticipated full weekend closure on this ramp during 2011.

All other traffic changes usually associated with this project will be suspended including:

- contra-flow traffic reversal
- closure of the northbound FDR exit ramp
- closure of Dover Street

Detour 1

Exit the FDR Drive at the Manhattan Civic Center/Pace University off-ramp (Exit 2). Turn left at Pearl Street to access the ramp onto the Brooklyn Bridge.

Detour 2

Continue traveling south on the FDR Drive until South Street near South Ferry. Make a u-turn at Exit 1, back onto the FDR Drive northbound, to use the access ramp onto the Brooklyn Bridge.

Alternate routes include the Manhattan Bridge and the Brooklyn Battery Tunnel (MTA-toll facility).


Pearl Street Off-Ramp

The Brooklyn Bridge off-ramp onto Pearl Street will be **closed** to Manhattan-bound traffic during this weekend closure. Drivers heading to:

Uptown Manhattan: Exit the Brooklyn Bridge at Center Street.

Downtown Manhattan: Exit the Brooklyn Bridge at Park Row South.

Traffic agents and variable message boards will be positioned to assist motorists through both detour routes.
