

- New school building (K437) under construction at Caton Ave & E 7th St
- Recent child fatality at Caton Ave & E 7th St
- Requests from CM Lander & community for safety improvements in Windsor Terrace/Kensington area



New School Construction



Students at K437

- 510-540 grade 3 5 students from P.S. 130
- 315-345 intermediate students (grades 6 thru 8)
- 55-65 Special Education / District 75 students

Previously zoned for K230


Curb Extensions

Concern: Long Crossing Distances, Unsafe Turns

Improvement: Curb Extensions at Caton Ave & E 7th St, E 8th St

Curb extensions will be constructed by the NYC School Construction Authority. Work will be completed before the opening of K437.

Timeline: Spring 2015



Caton Ave Corridor Project

Concern: Long Crossing Distances, Speeding, Unsafe Turns, Student Drop-Off

Proposal: Caton Avenue 2015 Project

DOT is currently developing a proposal to reduce Caton Avenue (From Coney Island Ave to Ocean Parkway) to one lane in each direction with a flush median, turn bays, and pedestrian safety islands in select locations.

Timeline: Anticipated Summer 2015

Concern: Long Crossing Distances, Speeding, Unsafe Turns LPI currently in place at Caton Ave & Ocean Parkway (9 seconds) Proposal: Caton Avenue 2015 Project

Timeline: Anticipated Summer 2015




Concern: Speeding

 - E 7th St & Caton Ave



Near PS 230 lower school:


 McDonald Ave from Caton Ave to Church Ave (Pilot 2-way zone)


- Concern: New school-related drop-offs and congestion
- Proposal: Street Conversions
- DOT proposal:
 - E 7th St to one-way NB Caton Ave to Kermit Pl
 - E 8th St to one way SB Caton Ave to Ocean Parkway
- Timeline: Spring 2015



Concern: Student pedestrian traffic

- Improvement: Markings & Signage around K437 building
- High visibility crosswalks and additional school signage will be added around the new K437 building
- Concern: School pick-up & drop-off
- Improvement: New parking regulations
- Parking regulations will be updated around the new K437 building to accommodate the needs of pick-up & drop-off times
- Timeline: Spring 2015








Concern: Long Crossing Distances, Speeding, Unsafe Turns

Proposal: New Crossing Guard at K437


A new crossing guard has been requested by CM Lander and by the DOT Brooklyn Borough Commissioner's office.

- Concern: Safe routes to schools
- Proposals: Signal and Stop Sign studies
- DOT will study new intersection controls at the following locations
- Caton Ave & E 8th St
- McDonald Ave & Terrace Pl
- McDonald Ave & Seeley St
- 19th St & Seeley St
- 20th St & Terrace Pl
- Vanderbilt St & 20th St/E 3rd St (all-way stop)

Timeline: Spring 2015



- Concern: No crosswalk or stop sign by subway exit
- Improvement: Stop sign and crosswalk
- On Ocean Parkway, across from PS130, servicing the Fort Hamilton F/G subway stop
- Timeline: Stop sign just installed, Spring 2015 for markings



Concern: Not Enough Crossing Time Proposal: Leading Pedestrian Intervals (LPIs)


Under study:

- E 7th St & Caton Ave
- Albemarle Rd & Dahill Ave
- Dahill Rd & 12th Ave

Installed:

Albermarle Rd & McDonald Ave (dual LPI)

Timeline: Early 2015




- Concern: Speeding on Residential Streets
- Proposal: Speed Bump studies
- Speed bump feasibility is being studied:
- 1. New K437 zoned area
- 2. Streets bordering new K437 building
 - Including E 7th & E 8th St, and Kermit PI
- Approved Speed Bumps:
- 1. Albemarle Rd btwn McDonald Ave & E 2nd St
- 2. Albemarle Rd btwn E 4th St & E 5^{th} St

Rejected Speed Bumps:

1. Albemarle Rd – 12 bumps feasible CIA to E 16th, rejected by CB August 2013

Studies to be Completed: Spring 2015



Concern: Speeding, school related traffic

Improvements: Upgrade Signs & Parking Regulations around PS 230

Signs and parking regulations will be updated around PS 230 upper school



The advanced warning sign will be relocated further south on McDonald Avenue



Update all school parking regulations to "No Standing Anytime, 7am – 4pm, School Days"

Additional Improvements

Concern: Long Crossing Distances, Unsafe Turns

- Proposal: Curb Extensions & Islands
- McDonald Ave & Church Ave
- Intersection will be reconstructed to remove former trolley tracks, bring roadway to state of good repair
- Curb extensions to be located on NW & SE corners
- Funded via Participatory Budgeting (CM Lander)
- Construction to begin in 2015
- McDonald Ave & Ft Hamilton Pkwy
- Project planning to be initiated soon
- Funded via Participatory Budgeting (CM Lander)
- Ocean Parkway & Church Ave
- Pedestrian refuge island installed in 2013
- Funded via Participatory Budgeting (CM Lander)

Timeline: Long Term



Additional Improvements

Concern: Speeding

Improvement: Parking Lane Stripe on Albemarle Rd

In response to requests from CM Lander's office & the community, DOT installed a parking lane stripe on Albemarle Rd (McDonald Ave to Ocean Parkway)

Timeline: Completed June 2014
