Community Request

 March 2010 – Need for corridor improvements identified in community workshop

Crash Data

- Corridor ranking in the 10% of high crash corridors in the Bronx
- Major crash locations along Longwood Ave:
 - Bruckner Blvd
 - Southern Blvd (1 pedestrian fatality in 2010)
 - Westchester Ave & Prospect
