


Vision Zero Priority Corridors / Areas

Vision Zero

- Multi-agency effort to reduce traffic fatalities in NYC
- Borough Action Plans released in 2015
- Priority Intersections, Corridors, and Areas identified for each borough
 - St Johns PI is in a Priority Area for Brooklyn. Ralph Ave, Saratoga Ave and Eastern Pkwy are Priority Corridors








Safety Data: Project Need

- 2010-14:
 - 123 total injuries
 - 12 KSI (persons killed or severely injured)



Project Location

- Commercial and residential land use
- Existing bicycle route on East New York Ave.



Existing Conditions – St. Johns Pl.

- St. Johns Pl. is a wide roadway (50') with one travel lane in each direction
- Long crossing distances; pedestrians have to cross 170' of roadway at Eastern Pkwy., with no refuge
- High Speeds: Up to 44% of cars traveling over the speed limit







Proposal: St Johns Pl Between Ralph Ave. and E New York Ave.

- Add 4' flush painted center median
- Mark bicycle lanes in both directions
 - Connects to existing route on E New York Ave., planned route in CB 8
- No changes to vehicle capacity






Proposal: St. Johns Pl. and Eastern Pkwy.




Proposal: Left Turn Restrictions

Restrict low volume NB and SB left turns from Eastern Pkwy.

- Prevents vehicles on Eastern Pkwy. from getting stuck behind left turners
- Allows medians to be fully extended into crosswalk



Proposal: Alternate Routes



Proposal: St. Johns Pl. & E. New York Ave.

- Add new crosswalk on north leg of the intersection of E New York Ave. and St. Johns Pl.
- Allows safer, easier access to B7, B12 bus stop





Project Benefits

- Provides shorter, safer pedestrian crossings
- Reduces speeding by marking standard width moving lanes
- Allows simpler, safer left turns
- Simplifies dangerous intersections for pedestrians and motor vehicles
- Provides new bicycle connection for Weeksville / Brownsville area
