Place Children Under 8 Years Old in a Child Safety Seat or Booster Seat

When your child outgrows his or her safety seat, use a booster seat until your child is at least eight years old or over 4-feet 9-inches tall. Seat belts alone are made for adults. A booster seat raises a child up so the seat belt fits, preventing the child from being thrown from the car in a crash.
