Hot Dog Eating Contest

According to archives, the Nathan's Famous International Hot Dog Eating Contest has occurred each July 4th in Coney Island, NY since 1916, the year Nathan Handwerker opened the legendary restaurant. Major League Eating, the governing body of all stomach-centric sport, sanctions the Nathan's Famous Hot Dog Eating Circuit and ensures the contests are judged professionally and that safety standards are in place at each event. If you're a female competitive eater, your chances of winning the Nathan's Famous hot dog-eating contest just got slightly easier. CNN reports that this year, Major League Eating, the event sponsor, has decided to separate the contest by gender, allowing the likes of Sonya "Black Widow" Thomas (personal record: 36 hot dogs and buns) and 100-pound hair salon-owner Juliet Lee (personal record: 34) to compete against other females, rather than four-time winner Joey Chestnut (personal record: 54). This year's event will be televised live on ESPN on Wednesday, July 4, at 3 p.m. ET. The show will include in-depth analysis of the eating competition by motorsports broadcaster Paul Page and Major League Eating's Richard Shea, with reporting by television host Renee Herlocker. The one-hour telecast will also include coverage of the Women's Championship. This year will be the ninth consecutive year ESPN has televised the event.
