Rolling Stone ranked him in the top 30 of its "100 Greatest Guitarists of All Time."

**QUINN SULLIVAN** - Quinn Sullivan is a 12-year-old blues guitar prodigy who has toured with Buddy Guy and been featured on several national television shows, including Ellen, Oprah, The Today Show, and Jimmy Kimmel Live.

**JOHN MAYALL** - John Mayall is often referred to as the "Father of the British blues." Founded in the 1950s, his band, John Mayall & The Bluesbreakers, has served as a launching pad for such legendary artists as Eric Clapton, Jack Bruce, Peter Green, John McVie, Mick Fleetwood, Mick

Taylor, and many more.
