The program begins with a 2 to 4 week orientation followed by a 12 week paid internship. Once interns have completed their internship, YAIP offers 9 months of follow-up services to help participants find a permanent job or a vocational/educational program.



## READ

READ is recruiting High School students for paid after-school jobs. READ trains and supports high school students to provide structured, research-based one-on-one tutoring to at-risk kindergarten and first grade students in basic reading skills.

The READ after-school programs run 1.5 hours a day, 3 or 4 days a week, for 15-20 weeks (50 sessions in all). Tutoring takes place at elementary school sites in all 5 boroughs and tutors earn \$7.25 per hour.
