This summer, MYM will focus on the potential of artists to contribute to their surroundings, impact their environments, and invent innovative solutions to real-world problems.

Summer sessions combine gallery-based experiences with studio-based art making and trips to local galleries and artist's studios. MYM participants also exhibit their work at the Museum at the end of the session.

Students interested in participating should:

be enrolled in high school during the regular school year OR be between the ages of 14-19; be interested in looking at, talking about and creating art; be able to attend the program according to the session schedule.
