END OF SUMMER BOAT PROGRAM

The Marine Rapid Response Rescue Craft Program (RRC) will conclude on Monday, October 28, 2013 at 2400 hours. Marine 3 (Brooklyn/Queens), Marine 4 (Queen/Bronx), and Marine 8 (Staten Island) will no longer be in service for the season. Marine Companies 1, 6 and 9 will remain in service; each of these companies has associated rescue craft as follows: 33' shallow draft rescue craft with 1000 gpm fire pump, and a 31' shallow draft medical boat. Marine 1 alpha for Manhattan responses, and Marine 9 alpha for responses from Bay Ridge to Sheepshead Bay area and parts of Jamaica Bay. Marine 6, 65' shallow draft fireboat, will remain in service for Brooklyn and Bronx responses. Chief Officers are reminded that these fast response boats can be special called within the five boroughs of the city.
