JOB DESCRIPTION

The Carpenter will construct and perform repair on building structures, equipment and furniture by following plans/sketches, using hand or powered tools to correct hazardous/unsafe conditions or upgrade current installations. This work involves rough/finished and general carpentry work including repair/replacement of structural components, installation/removal of floors, window frames, sashes, doors and door frames in order to maintain safe occupancy.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

1. Five years of full-time satisfactory experience as a Carpenter acquired within the last 10 years; or
2. Three years of experience as described in "1" above, plus sufficient training of a relevant nature acquired in an approved trade or vocational high school to make up a total of five years of acceptable experience. Six months of acceptable experience will be credited for each year of approved trade or vocational school training.

PREFERRED SKILLS:

A Motor Vehicle Driver License valid in the State of New York. This license must be maintained for the duration of employment.

NOTE: New York City residency is required within 90 days of appointment. However, City employees in certain titles who have worked for the City for 2 continuous years may also be eligible to reside in Nassau, Suffolk, Putnam, Westchester, Rockland, or Orange County.
