AMERICAN AIRLINES TO DONATE AIR TRAVEL FOR NYPD OFFICERS DEPLOYED ABROAD IN INTERNATIONAL LIAISON PROGRAM

Resources Will Enhance NYPD's Counterterrorism Efforts in Targeted International Markets

The Mayor's Fund to Advance New York City today announced that for the fourth year, American Airlines will support the New York Police Department's International Liaison Program by donating roundtrip travel for the New York City police officers who are stationed in 11 international markets. The donation will be administered by the New York City Police Foundation, an independent, non-profit organization that supports the services of the NYPD by providing essential resources that are not otherwise readily available to the department.

Established in 2002 as an innovative approach to confront threats both at home and overseas, the International Liaison Program is a cornerstone of Police Commissioner Raymond W. Kelly's counterterrorism strategy. The program stations NYPD investigators at strategic locations around the world through funding provided by the New York City Police Foundation. These liaisons work with local law enforcement agencies to gather intelligence and incorporate information into counterterrorism operations that protect New York City. The New York City Police Foundation funds living and travel expenses for NYPD officers working in the overseas markets and the NYPD is responsible for the salaries of the officers in the program.

"American Airlines has been a great partner of the City—from supporting a summer jobs program for young New Yorkers to the International Liaison Program," said Megan Sheekey President of the Mayor's Fund. NYPD detectives stationed around the world through the International Liaison Program continue to provide vital information that affects the security protocol and responsiveness of New York City. Immediately following the 2008 Mumbai attacks, three senior NYPD officers deployed in the International Liaison Program worked with local officials in Mumbai to gather data and assess the attacks. Information attained through these efforts was instantly channeled to New York, and within days, a new strategy for New York City to handle simultaneous attacks had been developed and deployed. Today, the NYPD continues to conduct emergency response drills based on lessons learned from the Mumbai attacks.

The Mayor's Fund to Advance New York City serves as the umbrella non-profit 501(c)(3) organization for the City of New York. The Mayor's Fund works closely with City agencies and partnering organizations to support public programs serving New Yorkers in all five boroughs.
