On Saturday, October 31, 2009 a psychiatric inpatient set fire to a

fixture in a bathroom. The smoke caught the attention of the staff and RACE procedures were immediately implemented. Patients were horizontally evacuated when staff retrieved a fire extinguisher and put out the fire. Hospital Police, FDNY, Safety and the AOD were on the scene within minutes. Patients were calmed, monitored and ultimately were able to return to the Unit. Some staff suffered smoke inhalation, but no serious injuries occurred because of the quick response of the staff. Thanks to our fellow colleagues, their alertness and ability to think and act appropriately in an emergency prevented greater harm and demonstrated exceptional customer service.
