PUERTO RICO'S NEW BIRTH CERTIFICATE LAW

The Government of Puerto Rico has enacted Law 191 of 2009, in an effort to combat fraud and identity theft to individuals born in Puerto Rico. Under the new law, all Puerto Rico birth certificates issued before July 1, 2010 will be invalidated so that new, more secure certificates can be issued. Those living in the states can request and receive their new birth certificates through a simple process by mail.

The cost is \$5.00. The fee is waived for persons over 60 years of age and for veterans. For more information go to info@prfaa.com.

On Tuesday, February 9, 2010, the Department of Health conducted a recertification inspection of the Hemodialysis Unit. The four day survey was to include an extensive inspection and testing of the water treatment system which is an integral part of Hemodialysis treatment. The system failed, delaying patient treatment. However, the Engineering Team responded immediately to the call for assistance.

It was determined that the failure occurred at different points in the complex system and that each required a coordinated solution. The Team worked cohesively to reconfigure the piping, repair a faulty valve, and remove the hard sediment from the city water source that caused the system to fail.

The department completed the tasks in record time. When the inspectors returned from the unit, the system was working *perfectly*. Thanks to the timely response, quick identification, and correction of the problems, the Hemodialysis Unit completed a successful re-certification survey!

APRIL CHECK CASHING

The check cashing arrangement at designated JP Morgan Chase Bank branches will continue for the remainder of April. Employees will be permitted to cash payroll checks drawn on the regular payroll account and the Central Office DEC Payroll on April 16 and April 30 only. The list of designated branches by facility

remains the same and maximum check amount that can be cashed is \$2,000. There is no charge to the employee to cash their check, provided they use the designated branches. The use of a non designated branch could result in a \$6.00 check cashing fee. There are identification guidelines for check cashing and non account holders cashing checks in excess of \$500 may be asked to provide a fingerprint. Should you encounter problems in cashing a check at a designated branch, go to the customer service desk and ask that an HHC Client Service professional be contacted.

Please note that free check cashing at designated branches will be discontinued after the April 30, 2010 payroll. Employees utilizing any Chase branch, designated or not, will be subject to a \$6.00 check cashing fee if they do not have a Chase bank account.

Chase representatives will be on site at HHC facilities on April 15 and 16, and April 29 and 30 to assist employees interested in enrolling in direct deposit. Direct deposit enrollment is available to B1 and B2 employees that currently have a bank account with Chase or another bank or those that open a bank account with Chase or another bank.)

As a result of Mount Vernon Manhattan Money Branch ceasing operations last month and the associated stoppage of onsite payroll check cashing services, HHC has terminated its contract and, as a result, on-site services will no longer be available to employees.
