## *Lorraine Tregde - Honoring A Legacy*

**M**s. Tregde served for 15 years as a Senior Executive with the NYC Health & Hospitals Corporation, which included appointments as Executive Director for seven major public hospitals, Jacobi and NCBH among them. Following her tenure with the HHC, Ms. Tregde served as Founding Director of the Medical Gateways Program for Cathedral High School, NYC.



Ms. Tregde's professional influence extended far beyond the boundaries of New York City. As a member of the Executive Committee and later as Chair of the National Association of Public Hospitals, she participated in numerous public hearings to promote the concept of the "safety net" hospital as a platform on the subject of national health reform. She developed a sister-city exchange program between public hospitals in New York City and Paris, and another exchange program with three hospitals in Albania. She was a staunch advocate for the United Nation's Healthy Babies, Healthy Mothers program.

A firm believer in sharing expertise with others, Ms. Tregde created two executive development programs: a national Fellows Program with the NAPH, and a specialized program for HHC administrators with the NYU Wagner School of Public Service. She also served as an adjunct professor and Director of Wagner's Residency Program. Through these programs, Ms. Tregde selflessly shared her experience and expertise with hundreds of professionals who now serve with distinction in leadership positions around the country.
