Awarded by Independent Non-Profit for High Standards in Keeping Patients Secure

Nov 29th 2012 – Jacobi Medical Center (Jacobi) and North Bronx Hospital (NCBH) were honored with an "A" Hospital Safety Score by The Leapfrog Group, an independent national nonprofit run by employers and other large purchasers of health benefits. The A score was awarded in the latest update to the <u>Hospital Safety Score</u> SM, the A, B, C, D or F scores assigned to U.S. hospitals based on preventable medical errors, injuries accidents, and infections. The Hospital Safety Score was compiled under the guidance of the nation's leading experts on patient safety and is designed to give the public information they can use to protect themselves and their families.

"This rating is a high honor for our institution" said Senior Vice President Bill Walsh of the North Bronx Healthcare Network, which includes both hospitals. "It's also recognition of the dedicated staff we have at both Jacobi and NCBH who work together day-in day-out in keeping our focus where it should be, on the patients we care for."

"Hospitals like these that earn an A have demonstrated their commitment to their patients and their community," said Leah Binder, president and CEO of The Leapfrog Group. "I congratulate Jacobi and NCBH for their safety excellence, and look forward to the day when all hospitals will match this standard."

Calculated under the guidance of The Leapfrog Group's nine-member Blue Ribbon Expert Panel, the Hospital Safety Score uses 26 measures of publicly available hospital safety data to produce a single score representing a hospital's overall capacity to keep patients safe from infections, injuries, and medical and medication errors. The panel includes: John Birkmeyer (University of Michigan), Ashish Jha (Harvard University), Lucian Leape (Harvard University), Arnold Millstein (Stanford University), Peter Pronovost (Johns Hopkins University), Patrick Romano (University of California, Davis), Sara Singer (Harvard University), Tim Vogus (Vanderbilt University), and Robert Wachter (University of California, San Francisco).
