In addition to providing safe and cost-effective room and board, shelter programs must assist clients to return to living with self-sufficiency in the community. Through this RFP, DHS is seeking qualified providers to operate two shelter facilities, 85 Lexington and Kenton Hall. Each shelter program will be comprised of program services and shelter operations. 85 Lexington is a 103-bed facility in Brooklyn, NY Kenton Hall is a 108-bed facility in New York, NY. This shelter will provide a substance abuse treatment program with enhanced services, including mental health, employment and housing assistance for homeless single men. Proposers may propose to operate more than one shelter facility. However, a complete and separate proposal must be submitted for each shelter facility proposed.
