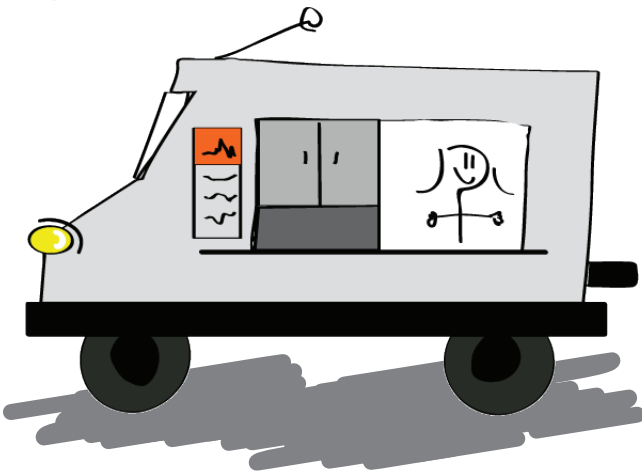


Global Partners Junior SUSTAINABILITY PROJECT

LIVING CITIES

This year, Global Partners Junior students are learning about the factors that make their cities sustainable, fun and healthy places to live, and how their actions as city residents impact the planet.

Students will show that sustainability can be “delicious” by designing a zero or low-impact street vendor cart that sells food inspired by a global city. The project is the culmination of this year’s “Living Cities” curriculum, reinforcing key learning objectives and drawing on students’ knowledge of density, efficiency, diversity, sustainable design and local food.



Each class will create:

- A recipe or menu describing the international food and its cuisine;
- Digital vendor cart design or model; and
- Promotional material explaining how the cart and food are sustainable.
