


# Plaques and Signage Program for Individual Landmarks and Historic Districts



## Program Outline

The New York Landmarks Preservation Foundation, a non-profit foundation, was established in 1980 to foster and promote the activities of the New York Landmarks Preservation Commission, a publicly chartered agency of the City of New York responsible for identifying, designating, and regulating city landmarks.

## Types of Plaques and Signage



### Historic District Brown Street Signs

The New York Landmarks Preservation Foundation's Street Sign Program places street signs in historic districts throughout the City. Signs can only be installed in locations where green street signs already exist, on existing street poles. The Landmarks Preservation Commission assists with the coordination of this program, and the Department of Transportation manufactures and installs the street signs. Community organizations and other interested parties interested in the installation of street signs

### Individual Landmark Bronze Plaque

The New York Landmarks Preservation Foundation's Individual Plaque program honors individual New York City landmarks. Landmarks Preservation Commission staff draft the plaque text, for applicant review and approval. Once text has been finalized, the Foundation and Commission staff arrange to have the plaque fabricated and delivered. Applicants are responsible for underwriting the cost of fabrication, receiving delivery, and arranging installation. *Please note: A valid Landmarks Preservation Commission permit, signed by the building owner, is required.* Plaques measure 19" x 22". Each plaque costs \$1500. Available to Individual landmarks only.



*What to submit with your application:* Completed plaque application form; LPC permit application form (available at [www.nyc.gov/landmarks](http://www.nyc.gov/landmarks)), signed by building owner; Photograph or drawing of building facade, close-up photograph of plaque location, and specifications for installation; Payment.



### Historic District Markers

The New York Landmarks Preservation Foundation's Historic District Marker Program places descriptive historic markers in historic districts throughout the City. Landmarks Preservation Commission staff draft the plaque text, for applicant review and approval. Once text has been approved by the applicant, the Foundation and Commission staff will arrange for fabrication and delivery. The Department of Transportation installs the signs. Cost varies; please contact the Foundation at 212-669-7817 for an estimate.

*What to submit with your application:* Completed plaque application form; Detailed map of the location(s) of the markers; Payment.
