The February 2013 Health & Human Services Committee meeting opened with an introduction of all committee members, guest board members and visitors.

MARCH WOMAN'S HISTORY MONTH BREAST CANCER SCREENING

The health committee is honoring women by partnering with Harlem Hospital and American Cancer Society to sponsor no-cost/low-cost mammograms at Harlem Hospital on March 9th, 16th, 23th and 30th. The coalition partners met to discuss operational concerns, plan the events, assign tasks in addition to developing a strategy on patient and media outreach to ensure a successful campaign. Sylvia White, Chief of Staff at Harlem Hospital, will provide the committee with an estimate of the clinic's capacity.

The mammogram services will be provided at Harlem Hospital; Dr Goldberg of Touro College has generously offered support services from Touro medical students. Mammograms will be charged to the insurance of those community members with coverage, patients without insurance will have prorated fees based on income with fees expected to range from \$10-\$25. The 'Pink Chose Me Foundation' will explore the possibility of providing funding for those that are uninsured and unable to pay any fees.

Based on ACS's experience with the "Love Yourself Campaign" it was decided that appointments would not be scheduled, by having walk-ins it avoids any violations of HIPPA (Health Insurance Portability and

Accountability Act). Mrs. White of Harlem Hospital will make arrangements for adequate staff; Hunter College students have also agreed to volunteer with an expected schedule of 8am-1pm.

An in-depth discussion was had regarding accommodating community members with disabilities. Harlem Hospital uses 'Deaf-Talk', follow-up is needed to confirm mobile screens.

<u>Planned outreach partners</u>: Greater Harlem Chamber of Commerce, Harlem Times, Daily News, News Day, WBLS, New York 1 and Post. American Cancer Society and Harlem Hospital will issue a joint press release on the campaign.

Flyers will be translated to French and Spanish, ASL interpreters will be provided upon request. A local clinic that serves Muslim women will be contacted in addition to 'African Services Committee'.

Community targets for advertising include: grocery stores, community boards and housing community boards/tenant associations, hair salons and laundromats.
