- Closed down for the evening/day - 159 Dance Studio between Amsterdam closed due to noise and loud music – summons issued
- Closed down for the evening/day - Vegis at 172 and Audubon closed down at 4 am due to overcrowding and loud music
- Two New Year's permits issued - Vapor and Presidente – no reports
  - 4 C summonses for noise complaints
  - 2 Arrests, a misdemeanor and one open warrant as a result as a car stop
- 20 extra police officers working
- No reports of shots fired

**Non-New Year's Eve:**

The 33<sup>rd</sup> Precinct reported that two men are wanted for the rape of a woman in Highbridge Park. The case is under investigation but the precinct noted that there is likely more to the story, possibly that the suspects and victim knew each other.

## **Update from the 34<sup>th</sup> Precinct (presented by Inspector Morello)**

### **New Year's Eve**

#### Establishments NOT Recommended By The 34<sup>th</sup> Precinct

El Tina, 500 West 207<sup>th</sup> Street; Viva Tapas, 65 Sherman Avenue; Fantastic Lounge, 238A Sherman Avenue; Mimosa, 253-271 Sherman Avenue

#### Totals are from 3:00pm 12/31/15 – 9:00am 1/1/16

311 – 67 Calls

911 – 332 Calls

Summonses Issued – 20

Arrests – 8

- 27 places granted New Year's Eve permits this year while 30 were granted in 2014
- Tette closed and no permit for El Tina where there were problems last year,
- Apt. 78 was shut down this year due to overcrowding with one person arrested for inciting a riot. This was the establishment's last day of operation. Café de Luna and Dyckman Bar were overcrowded and closed down for the evening/day. Summonses issued.
- 1 shooting (shots fired) and robbery @ 73 Elwood. Expect to have perpetrator in custody soon. He's always wanted for murder in the 48<sup>th</sup> Precinct
- Plenty of fireworks all over the neighborhood from 181 to Inwood by the park
- Same amount of personnel as last year

### **Non-New Year's Eve related**

- One pedestrian fatality all year – 207<sup>th</sup> Street
- Moving violations: 6,060 up from 5,303 up 19.2%
- Eric Rodriguez from Crime Prevention to look for handouts given out to clubs for nightlife safety in light of the death of Cliff patron Anthony Urena
- Inspector Morello checking with NYPD Legal Department to see if we can obtain copies of licenses issued by SLA

- Rabbi mural: The image reportedly depicted a rabbi with a bomb on the 187<sup>th</sup> Street staircase. Discussion noted that the image may or may not have been a rabbi and the tag may or may not have been a bomb but the graffiti artist's tag. Inspector Morello says he received no concerns from the Orthodox community in the area.
- 13.9% increase in index crime
- 39.3% increase in arrests made for major felonies
- Shootings up by 1 to 8
- Arrests up 57% this year
- Fort Tryon Park pattern, rash of 10 robberies committed by 14 year old

Year to Date, 28-Day Report and Week to Date Report:  
 -82% increase in gun arrests from 2104 to 2015
