#### Discussion that took place as indicated below:

Members of the Committee and the audience were introduced by the chair.

The order of the agenda was changed unanimous consensus (new and old business were discussed first)

- A community announcement was share by: Al Kurkland regarding the Police Athletic league.
- All encouraged the CB12M to spread the word and advise parents of middle school ages children to join the following PAL's after school programs available at the Armory Center:
  - -STERM; Art & Crafts; Trips Girl Talk; Comic con; Fashion; Dance; Sports; Tutoring; Computer lab; Holiday Camp among others. He (Al) also shared several literatures about PAL's programs.
  - Committee member suggested AI to visit and present at the Dyckman Houses Tenant Association Meeting and at the CB12M's Public Hearing Meeting on October 15<sup>th</sup> @ 7PM to raise program awareness for funding purpose.
- Committee discussed about the unfolding of the pending forum on Mental Health & Emotional Learning, which
  has been postponed on several occasions. At this time, the committee's recommendation was for January 2020.
- Chair also discussed the Holiday event "Youth Performing for seniors" at Isabella Geriatric Center. She informed
  that she attended the Aging Committee's meeting for possible arrangements. The date for the event still pending,
  but will be held around mid-December.
- Committee Chair brought forward the pending goal to host a forum on Mental Health & Emotional Learning to the committee.
  - There was also a discussion on the selection for an appropriate date for the event.
- Chair mentioned that committee members are at liberty to invite guest speakers and presenters to the committee meetings. She also suggested copying her on any request.
- Committee member Maria Luna discussed the need for a possible construction for a new school in District 6 (Capital Requests). However, details about the school's grades were not discussed, but the idea was not adopted.
- A member from the public- Ms. Maritza Polanko representative of IDI, suggested the committee to advocate for programs to assist students and parents with technical job training.
- Committee member Ms.James, inquired about the increase of schools' needs including I.S. 52 for budget requests. The committee embraced her request and explained the procedures. However, due to the lack of information, Ms. James did not recommend any budget items for I.S. 52 at this time (the school she mentioned).
- Chair encouraged Ms. James to attend the Budget Public Hearing on October 15<sup>th</sup> and provide any budget item(s) for their consideration.
