The meeting was called to order by Fe Florimon at 7:07 pm. Discussion that took place as indicated below:

Members of the Committee and the audience were introduced by the Chair followed by the review of the agenda.

1. Presentation: "Updates from Zeta Inwood 1" by *Emily A. Kim, CEO of Zeta Charter Schools* CEO Emily Kim her school's team.

- ✓ Emily Kim, CEO of Zeta Charter Schools, and Amanda Simmons, Principal of Zeta Inwood 1 Elementary School, attended the committee meeting with a group of parents and children who attend Zeta Inwood 1. Ms. Kim and Principal Simmons provided an update of the school, with the aim of deepening the school's relationship with the community board. Now in its second year of operation, Zeta Inwood 1 serves kindergarten through 2nd grade, and it is adding one grade each year until it serves kindergarten through 5th grade.
- ✓ Ms. Kim and Principal Simmons shared about the academics and the specialty activities offered by the school. By the end of its first year, 90% of its students were on grade level, representing between 60-70 percentage points of academic growth since the beginning of the year. The school is also very focused on whole-child education and social-emotional learning, teaching kids to practice meditative breathing, self knowledge, and appreciation for peers. Some of the specialty activities offered to students include music, chess, violin, Taekwondo, and sports.

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✓ Each of the Zeta parents present shared with the committee their child's positive experience at the school. Ms. Kim explained that the school is in a temporary private facility that is not big enough to accommodate the school at full scale, K to 5th grade. They are in the process of negotiating a permanent, private facility that will house the school starting the 2022-23 or 2023-24 school year. While they are waiting for the building to be completed, they need an extension space as they grow, and have been seeking private facilities for this extension space. Given the scarcity of suitable private facilities, they have also requested a temporary co

-location space from the DOE. The school has committed to moving into permanent, private facilities in 2022-23 or 2023-24. Ms. Kim and Principal Simmons answered questions from the committee and from the public. Ms. Kim and Principal Simmons expressed their gratefulness for the opportunity to present to the committee, and look forward to deepening the relationship.
