

**Resolution in Support of a Public Art Installation
at Dyckman Street/ Broadway / Riverside Drive
Traffic & Transportation and Parks & Cultural Affairs Committee
March 25th, 2014**

- Whereas:** The Washington Heights Business Improvement District (BID) gave a presentation on its “Artervention” Program to Community Board 12, Manhattan’s Traffic & Transportation Committee on March 3rd, and to the Board’s Parks & Cultural Affairs Committee on March 4th, detailing the program’s goals of installing public art for beautification and interest; and
- Whereas:** The BID proposes to relocate a large sculpture entitled, “Pod,” from its current temporary installation on the mall on Malcom X Blvd. / Lenox Ave. @ W. 124th St., to the triangle at the confluence of Broadway, Riverside Drive & Dyckman Street; and
- Whereas:** This would be a temporary installation, for one year; and
- Whereas:** The exact placement would be determined in consultation with the Department of Transportation, the Riverside Inwood Neighborhood Garden, and the MTA, making sure to not impede pedestrian movement or visibility from any vehicles, to not interfere with RING’s periodic flea markets and art shows, and to consider any structural requirements or limitations given the presence of a subway station below the intersection; and
- Whereas:** Any holes or other damages to the sidewalk will be repaired following the removal of the installation; now therefore be it
- Resolved:** That Community Board 12, Manhattan approves of the proposed temporary installation of “Pod” in the pedestrian triangle at the confluence of Broadway, Riverside Drive & Dyckman Street.
