As a result, Community Board 12 Manhattan, passed a resolution of **Objection** to the New York State Liquor Authority New Application for an On-Premises Liquor License for 2244 Cristina Restaurant Corp.; and

Whereas, 2244 Cristina Restaurant Corp. – 2244 Amsterdam Ave (corner of W 172nd St) 10032, has duly notified Community Board 12 Manhattan of its intention to file an application for a New On-Premises Liquor License; and

Whereas, the Licensing Committee met on November 8th, 2017 to hear comments from the community and the precinct regarding this New license application; and

Whereas, the proposed establishment is on the street level of a mixed commercial and residential five (5) story building with 18 residential units; and

Whereas, the proposed restaurant will operates with a total of 16 tables, 53 chairs, with a total maximum legal capacity of 74 persons. Proposed hours of operation Sunday to Tuesday 7AM to 2AM, Wednesday to Saturday 7AM to 4AM; and

Whereas, the 33rd Precinct indicated that there have been issues with the previous owner:

- · numerous noise complaints
- 9/23/16 MARCH Operation: six (6) summonses issued: one (1) SLA, five (5) DOH
- 11/19/16 positive underage sell
- 12/18/16 positive underage sell
- 12/31/16 grand larceny
- 3/3/17 MARCH Operation: four (4) summons issued: one (1) SLA, four (4) DOH
- April 18, 2017 the owner was served with papers
- 7/29/17 criminal possession of a weapon and reckless endangerment
- 9/7/17 harassment
- 9/14/17 license was canceled
- the 33rd Precinct indicated that they have no record of the shooting; and

Whereas, The new owner stated that he has no relationship, friendship or family with the previous owner and does not know him; and

Whereas, in light of the issues stated by the 33rd Precinct, the Licensing Committee requests that the owner implement stipulations. The applicant agreed in writing to implement the stipulations stated below prior to the Community Board 12 Manhattan General Meeting on November 28th, 2017;

- The owner, Carlos, will meet with the 33rd Precinct prior to the GM on November 28th, 2017
- · Closing hour no later than midnight on weekdays, and 2AM Friday to Saturday
- Will have DJ only on Friday and Saturday
- Will employ security personnel on Friday and Saturday
- Install soundproofing
- Provide proof of the installation
- Residents can contact the manager and owner with any issues or complaints they may have at 201-969-6845
 - Install a Good neighbor sign
 - Install sound limiters on all audio equipment
 - Will not seek any modification of any SLA issued license on or before November 8, 2018
 - Owner will meet with the 33rd precinct on a monthly basis thereafter; and

Whereas, the owner stated that they will add security personnel Friday to Sunday, and security cameras. The owner also indicated that the ceiling was already sound proofed; and

At the General Meeting on Tuesday, November 28th, 2017, with a vote of 8 in favor, 25 opposed, 2 abstentions, 0 not voting, the Licensing Community recommendation for this license failed. As a result, Community Board 12 Manhattan, passed a resolution of **Objection** to the New York State Liquor Authority New Application for an On-Premises Liquor License for Baja's Tapas Restaurant & Bar Inc. dba TBD.; and

Whereas, Baja's Tapas Restaurant & Bar Inc. dba TBD – 229 Dyckman St (btw Broadway & Seaman) 10034, pending license # 1302569, has duly notified Community Board 12 Manhattan of its intention to file an application for a New On- Premises Liquor License; and

Whereas, the Licensing Committee met on November 8th, 2017 to hear comments from the community and the precinct regarding this proposed New license application; and

Whereas, the proposed establishment is on the street level of a of a six (6) story mixed residential and commercial building with 74 residential units; and

Whereas, the proposed restaurant will operate with a total of 13 tables, 26 chairs and 6 bar stools, with a total maximum legal capacity of 74 persons. Proposed hours of operation Sunday to Thursday 12PM to 12AM, Friday & Saturday 12PM to 2AM; and

Whereas, the proposed establishment's Method of Operation includes iPod, Internet, Recorded Music only; and

Whereas, the 34th Precinct would like to meet with the owner whose name will be on the liquor license. Far too many times representatives have nothing to do with the licensee and therefore not accountable for slashing's and other problems that have occurred at the establishment. The 34th Precinct would like to have direct contact with the owners and will not render any position for this business at this point; and

Whereas, this establishment has been closed for some time due to previous issues; and

Whereas, Dyckman strip has ten (10) On-Premises Liquor licenses already, and other than two (2) locations, the restaurants between Broadway and La Marina do not act as restaurants past at 10PM; and

Whereas, the 34th Precinct informed the Committee that at the first weekend in November, someone was slashed on the street right next to the proposed establishment. The individual came out of the restaurant next door and was attacked by a group of people. This is not a stand-alone incident on this street between Broadway and Payson, but a frequent occurrence; and

Whereas, there had been 1600 calls to 911 between Broadway and La Marina alone; and

Whereas, we understand that people invested money in this location but it is unfortunate that the owner did not reach out to the Precinct before investing in a location. The public's safety is at stake here and should not be taken lightly; and

Whereas, members of the community voiced their concern and objections to this license due to the saturation of licenses between Broadway and Payson. The blocks in Upper Manhattan are not standard size city blocks but far shorter; and

Whereas, there had been 1286 noise complaints at this location in 2015 alone. The establishment was temporarily closed due to legal issues such as serving to minors. The owner was convicted of a felony and forced to close but continued to operate the establishment for several months afterwards until February 2016; and

Whereas, the proposed establishment did not post the hearing notice as asked, but posted an old one from June 2016; and

Whereas, when asked, the representative of the establishment stated that this license request is not under the previous owner's license # 1295256; and

Whereas, in light of the issues stated by the 34th Precinct and the community, the Licensing Committee requests that the owner implement stipulations. The applicant agreed in writing to implement the stipulations stated below prior to the Community Board 12 Manhattan General Meeting on November 28th, 2017;

- the owner, Mendez Yahaira will meet with the 34th precinct prior to the Community Board
 12 Manhattan General Meeting in November 28th, 2017
- the owner will close the establishment no later than 12AM Sunday to Thursday and 2AM Friday & Saturday
- install soundproofing and provide proof of such installation

- residents can contact the owner and/or manager with any issues or complaints at 646-271-0673
- install a Good Neighbor sign
- install sound limiter on all audio equipment
- the owner will not seek any modification to the SLA issued license on or before the renewal date of any SLA issued licenses; therefore, be it
