Re: Resolution in Support of the Concept of Creating a Community Land Trust in Community Board 12 District using Safety City and other underutilized city/state owned properties.

Dear Mayor Bill De Blasio:

At the General Meeting, Tuesday, December 19, 2017 Community Board 12 Manhattan, passed a resolution with a vote of 38 in favor, 0 opposed, 1 abstention supports the concept that vacant city-controlled properties (including Safety City and other underutilized city/state owned properties in the district) be transferred from the relevant city agency now controlling each property to HPD in anticipation of potential transfer to this community through an open and transparent Community Land Trust.

Whereas, Preliminary review determined that Safety City Lot on West 158th Street (Block: 2134 Lot: 218) owned by the City of New York is currently underutilized, and

Whereas, There may be additional sites which are owned by the City of New York/New York State; and

Whereas, A Community Land Trust allows for preservation and creation of housing and other productive uses which would be affordable in perpetuity and also allows the opportunity for the community to determine and control the mechanisms for governance through a democratic process so deemed suitable for the community (i.e., work with non-profit developers to deepen affordability); and

Whereas, A Northern Manhattan Community Land Trust is already in formation by a working group of Community Board 12, Manhattan residents who responded to a January 2017 "HPD Request for Expressions of Interest" and were selected from a large group of respondents by the City to participate in a training and technical assistance program to form and develop community land trust across the city; and

**Whereas**, There are over 200 Community Land Trust nationwide in operation, including the newly created East Harlem/El Barrio community land trust which endeavors to preserve more than 100 units of housing for hundreds of East Harlem residents and their families; and

Whereas, The focus on exclusively City-Owned vacant property allows for the City of New York to advance projects for development in an expeditious manner and also to enforce affordability thresholds that will meet the need for the great demand of such in our city, now therefore be it

Resolved, Community Board 12, Manhattan supports the concept that aforementioned vacant city-controlled properties (including Safety City and other underutilized city/state owned properties in the district) be transferred from the relevant city agency now controlling each property to HPD in anticipation of potential transfer to this community through an open and transparent Community Land Trust.
