
Large "unzoned" areas with limited set of zoned schools

- Increase middle school capacity by 400 seats

### Middle School Issues : Outdated Zones

Outdated Zones

- "Unzoned" schools : Three elementary schools (PS 111, PS 51, PS 33) have no corresponding zoned Middle School.
- Zoning Ratio : 4 zoned Middle Schools accommodate 30 zoned elementary schools
- Zoning Imbalance : Baruch serves as the zoned school for 60% of District 2 students

# Middle School Issues : Inefficient Admissions

#### Inefficient Admissions

- Opaque : Limited information available to help drive admissions decisions
  - Average student profile
  - School review process
- Parent Capacity
  - Process is labor intensive (School tours, school fairs, etc)
- Complicated
  - Enrollment process and procedures are difficult for even the most "engaged" families to navigate.

### Middle School Model: Potential Objectives

Neighborhood Cohesion

Maintain neighborhood schools and keep students within local community

### **Balanced Demographics**

Ensure enrollment by race, gender, need index reflects overall district

**Aligned Student Capabilities** 

**Psychological Impact** 

Ensure students with similar capabilities and interests are together

Minimize the psychological impact of the process on students

### **Structural Issues**

- *Choice:* What does "Choice" mean within the current MS system?
  - Application choice? Admissions choice?
- Academic Diversity: How differentiated are the curricular offerings across MS?
  - Does a "Science" focused school differ from an "Arts" focused school?
  - What are the benefits? At this age?
- Admissions: What is the benefit of MS admissions being able to see "student preference"?
  - Ease administrative burden? Improve matching process? Allow schools to look beyond test scores?
- Information: How transparent and consistent are MS admissions?
  - Do parents have the needed information to make informed choices? Is the matching process understandable?
- Zoning: What is (and what should) the role of zoned schools be within our District?
  - Neighborhood schools? Option for struggling students? Tracking?
