It continues to be one of our highest priorities. CB 2 has long recognized that this is a difficult intersection of three streets caused by the widening of 7th Ave. many years ago. This is a dangerous intersection for pedestrian crossing particularly on the south side of 7th Ave. due to cars turning from Bleeker and going down 7th Ave. An NYC DOT study of the intersection at Mulray Square resulted in significant improvements to a similar intersection.
