Ambulance

An ambulance provides emergency and non emergency transportation. Ambulances are serviced by emergency medical technicians who either provide treatment to those in need of immediate care or arrange for timely transport to the next level of care (emergency room).

Types of Ambulance Service:

Basic Life Support (BLS)

It is a level of medical care, which is used for patients with life threatening illnesses or injuries until a person can be given full medical care at a hospital.

Advanced Life Support (ALS)

It is a set of life saving protocol and skills that extend BLS to further support the circulation and provide an open airway and adequate ventilation. Skills include cardiac monitoring, cardiac defibrillation, intravenous cannulation, medication administration through parenteral and enteral routes, and pediatric advanced life support to name a few.
