Reconstruction of 9th Avenue / Gansevoort Street Area

Chelsea

The New York City Department of Design and Construction (NYC-DDC) is managing the reconstruction of 9^{TH} Avenue/Gansevoort Street area in the Meatpacking District section of Manhattan. This reconstruction will include amenities such as: tree planting, plaza reconstruction and decorative paving, new roadways, curbs, and sidewalk. Our project anticipates substantial completion by Spring of 2019. Due to inclement weather and field conditions, this period is subject to change.

Work Completed on the First Quarter

In the last quarter, the project has completed most of the Cobblestone installation at the south of West 14th Street: On Gansevoort Street between Hudson Street and Greenwich Street including Gansevoort Plaza, on 9th Avenue between Gansevoort Street and West 14th Street as well as a large portion of Chelsea Plaza.

As a temporary measure of protection, large granite blocks have been placed around the plazas on West 14^{th} Street between 9^{th} Avenue and Hudson Street, as well as Gansevoort Street between Hudson Street and 9^{th} Avenue.

West 13^{th} Street between Hudson Street and 9^{th} Avenue has been reopened.

Proposed Work Schedule: Second Quarter of 2019

Weather permitting, the project will continue with Cobblestone Roadway installation on 9th Avenue between West 14th Street and West 15th Street (Outside the Apple Store). In addition to the remaining installation of curb and sidewalk along 9th Avenue between West 14th Street and West 16th Street (Various Locations), and new road base along 9th Avenue between West 15th Street and West 16th Street (Outside Chelsea Market and the Google Building).

Watermain and gas line replacement will also take place at the south-east corner of West 15th Street and utility relocations on the east side of 9th Avenue between West 15th Street and West 16th Street. Con Edison and Verizon will continue conduit installations on the Hudson and Gansevoort Streets intersection. Landscaping is planned, Spring 2019.

Community Impacts
