Here in the waning hours of June 27, 1969, the police raided the Stonewall Inn, a bar that served the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) community. What followed were six days of sporadic uprisings by hundreds of LGBT individuals, demanding an end to police harassment, arrests and raids on LGBT establishments. The Stonewall Rebellion is widely regarded as the catalyst for the modern LGBT liberation movement.
