

- Located between Rivington and Stanton Street
- Mixed-use property comprised of 16 apartments and 2 retail stores
- Taqueria Diana (Mexican restaurant)
 Opening in early 2017

Project Facts

- Installed only after street encroachment in front of 50 Clinton Street construction site is removed (estimated May 2017).
- A standard design version of the seats will be installed at the property.
- Maintenance of the seats will be handled solely by building management and building personnel.

How it Works

- Application based
- Community Board approved
- Installed along the parking lane
- Three design types
- Seasonal- March until December

Standard Design

- 6 feet wide
- 20' feet long segments
- Platform flush with the curb
- Plastic pallet subsurface
- Deck tile finish
- Planter boxes
- Stainless steel cables
- Moveable furniture













Safety

- Provided by DOT
- Wheel stop bars on either end
- Flexible delineators along the edge
- Painted white parking line
- 'No Standing Anytime' (NSA) signs on either side

Operation

- All seating open to public
- No alcohol or smoking allowed
- No commercial activity (e.g., waiter service)
- Moveable furniture removed & stored by partner
- Partner responsible for maintenance via an agreement with DOT
