ALTERNATE SIDE PARKING RULES SUSPENSION CALENDAR The City suspends alternate side parking (ASP) rules on legal and religious holidays. There are no "major legal holidays" this month so only street cleaning rules are suspended, all other regulations remain in effect. There are three (3) dates in February 2012: 2/13 (Mon.), 2/20 (Mon.), 2/22 (Wed.).

The application has been released for the **DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS (DCA) CULTURAL DEVELOPMENT FUND (CDF) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2013**. Again, the application will be done solely and entirely online through a secure web-based application. The application and information on how to fill it out can all be found at www.nyc.gov/culture. A panel of individuals from the cultural community as well as a representative of the City Council will judge all applications. Organizations with annual operating budgets under \$250,000 will be evaluated through a borough-based panel process, which includes a representative from the Office of the Borough President. Organizations with annual operating budgets over \$250,000 will be evaluated through a City-wide, discipline-based process. *The applications are due on February 13th with funding decisions made by the summer.* In order for a cultural group to be eligible to receive Member Items through DCA (and to participate in the CASA program) as part of the Fiscal 2013 budget adoption process, all groups must submit a Fiscal Year 2013 CDF Application. The DCA informed their database of the availability of the application and will hold a series of application seminars throughout the City. An organization can register to attend a seminar on the DCA's website.

NYPD ELECTRONIC DEVICE THEFT REDUCTION PROGRAM The NYPD Transit Bureau has an excellent way for all passengers on our subway system to safeguard their electronic devices. Such as, i-Pods, Cell phones, Portable PlayStation, Blackberries, etc. All you have to do is the following:

- Stop by one of our etching stations and have one of our officers etch your device.
- Call one of the transit districts listed at http://www.nyc.gov/html/nypd/downloads/pdf/crime_prevention/crime_prev_electronics.pdf or call (718) 694-1390 for available times for etching services.

The process takes about 3 minutes. The officer will give you a registration form to fill out. By the time the form is done, your electronic device would have been etched. We use an invisible Ultra Violet permanent ink marker, which glows under an ultra violet light. The markings are invisible to the human eye. We mark electronic devices in two places: usually on the front or back and inside the device. This information is placed in our database along with your information. We also record the devices serial number for added identification purposes. In the event a device is lost or stolen, we will be able to give it to registered owners once recovered.
