West End Avenue Redesign: Senator Espaillat expressed his support for the West End Avenue redesign. By removing one lane in each direction, creating a turning lane, and adding pedestrian islands to prevent unsafe turns, this residential corridor will become safer for all.

At Senator Espaillat's urging, there has been a stepped-up Parks Enforcement Patrol (PEP) and Department of Sanitation presence, which will return Juan Pablo Duarte Square to an attractive seating area.
