Re: Curb Ramp Detectable Warnings

Dear Commissioner Forgione:

During the Transportation Planning Committee of Manhattan Community Board No. 4's August meeting, Andrew Hallerman announced the schedule of upcoming street resurfacing in our community.

As always, Mr. Hallerman was very helpful providing information and inviting the Board's input. The Committee noted the large number of street-miles to be resurfaced. In regard to the instances where street resurfacing will also include construction of new curb ramps or reconstruction of existing ones, the Board would like to reemphasize the importance of the federal regulation requiring that curb ramps receive "detectable warning strips". These strips provide visual and tactual information to all pedestrians who ordinarily depend on the presence of full-height curbing to distinguish between safe pedestrian areas and street lanes. The also serve to alert all pedestrians about sudden changes in the plane of the sidewalk.

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We thank you for your attention to this matter. If for some reason NYC DOT does not interpret the federal standards in the same way that we do, we hope that your staff with contact the District Office so that we can further discuss a matter that is very important for pedestrian safety in our community.
