Manhattan Community Board #4 supports your efforts to enact desperately needed changes to the 421-a Program. As the 421-a program was originally established in the 1970's to provide incentives for developers to build in a nearly bankrupt New York City, the current healthy economy and the resulting proliferation of development in and around the City necessitates a serious review of the requirements and benefits of the program and the use of public funds

We heartily support changes to this program that increase opportunities to create affordable housing and ensure that all units created are affordable in perpetuity. Our community is in desperate need for housing affordable to a range of low, moderate and middle income families. We look forward to working with you and Assembly Member Gottfried to ensure that any new legislation governing the 421-a Program responds to our needs and those of neighborhoods across the City.

Thank you once again for taking the lead on this important issue and promoting affordable housing in our communities.
