Re: Completion of Dyer Avenue's pedestrian ramps and crossings

Manhattan Community Board 4 wishes to thank the DOT for the pedestrian ramps installed in recent months as part of the Eight Avenue repaying. An area that remains of concern is Dyer Avenue at both 34th and 35th Streets, where Dyer Avenue leads into the northbound underground access to the Lincoln Tunnel.

Two years ago, some of the pedestrian ramps were built at these intersections, while others were not. There is a concentration of elderly residents on the western end of 35^{th} street toward 10^{th} Avenue, and a church is located on the south side of 34^{th} street less than 200 feet from the entrance of Dyer Avenue.

Community Board 4 requests that the following pedestrian ramps improvements be completed as soon as feasible:

- Install ADA compliant pedestrian ramps (section 4.7 of ADAAG) with detectable warnings (section 4.29.2 of ADAAG) at the following locations:
 - On 34th Street, at <u>both</u> ends of the pedestrian crossing located west of the intersection with Dyer Avenue
 - On Dyer Avenue , at the east end of the pedestrian crossing located on the north side of the intersection with 34th Street
- Repaint the outline and stripes of the five pedestrian crossings at the intersection of Dyer Avenue and 35th Street.

Paint a grid on the pavement at the intersection to prevent gridlock.
