**ALTERNATE SIDE PARKING RULES SUSPENSION CALENDAR** The City suspends alternate side parking (ASP) rules on legal and religious holidays. On major legal holidays (those with a \*\*), stopping, standing and parking are permitted except in areas where stopping, standing and parking rules are in effect seven days a week (e.g., "No Standing Anytime"). Parking meter regulations are also suspended on major legal holidays. On all other holidays, only street cleaning rules are suspended, all other regulations remain in effect. There are four (4) dates in February 2013: 2/12 (Tue.), 2/13 (Wed.), 2/18 (Mon.) and 2/24 (Sun.).

**LONG TERM CONTROL PLAN: CITYWIDE MODELING WORKSHOP** Thursday, February 28, 2013 at US Customs House, Auditorium, 1 Bowling Green from 6:00pm - 8:00pm. The New York City Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is co-hosting a citywide workshop to present and review the modeling processes that will be used to test potential alternatives identified as part of the Long Term Control Plan (LTCP) Program with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). At the workshop, DEP and DEC staff will review the Watershed/Landside and Hydrodynamic/Water Quality models and the proposed baseline assumptions for evaluating the benefits of CSO control alternatives. Also, DEP and DEC staff will be available to answer any questions you may have.

As part of the LTCP Program, DEP is developing comprehensive evaluations of long term solutions to reduce combined sewer overflows (CSOs) and improve water quality in New York City's waterbodies and waterways. The goal of each LTCP is to identify appropriate CSO controls necessary to achieve waterbody-specific water quality standards, consistent with the Federal CSO Policy and the water quality goals of the Clean Water Act.
