## Re: 400 West 20<sup>th</sup> Street

Dear Chair Tierney,

Manhattan Community Board 4 is writing about the application presented by Therese Virserius Design to alter two facades of the referenced property<sup>1</sup>.

The applicant proposes to install a dark anodized aluminum and glass sliding and folding storefront at the Ninth Avenue facade. The building has an historic ornamented cast iron structural column at the corner of W. 20<sup>th</sup> Street that the applicant plans to restore and leave exposed to view. This column is shown in the 1940 tax photo, not enclosed in the façade, but free-standing at the corner entrance to the store. The applicant proposes to open the corner with a vestibule allowing access to enter both from Ninth Avenue and from W. 20<sup>th</sup> Street.

The Landmarks Committee notes receipt of correspondence from residents of the 400 block of W. 20<sup>th</sup> Street opposing a doorway, on the W. 20th Street side and requesting that the restaurant entry be only on the avenue side as is presently the case.

The Board recommends <u>denial</u> of any W. 20<sup>th</sup> Street entry <u>but approval</u> of the exposed column in the corner and the door facing the Ninth Avenue, as presented to the Landmarks Committee.

The applicant proposes to eliminate one double hung window on the north (W.  $20^{\text{th}}$  St) façade, and restore the sealed opening with stucco to match the existing finish, and to install a large anodized aluminum and glass window near the W.  $20^{\text{th}}$  St. corner corresponding to the Avenue storefront façade.

The Board recommends approval of these items.
