Chair's Report – Mark Thompson

1) Thank residents of Kips Bay – especially our own Public Member Liz Gebiner - Kips Bay Neighborhood Alliance and Toni Carlina for working with me and DOT to get the ball rolling on fixing unsafe conditions on Second Avenue at 33rd and 30th Streets. DOT is now looking into changing the traffic lights and pedestrian crossing timing to give pedestrians more time to cross before cars are able to turn into the crosswalk. As part of that effort DOT has announced that 30th Street from Lexington to the FDR will be repaved before the end of May. Congratulations. On Monday evening about 80 people gathered at Baruch College for a visioning session for the Blueway, which is the southern part of our waterfront. It was a successful event, with many members of CB6 there along with residents and representatives from community based organizations. As you know, at 6pm tomorrow evening CB6 is co-hosting a Forum on the Esplanade here at NYU Medical Center downstairs in Auditorium A. State Senator Liz Krueger, Assembly Member Brian Kavanagh and City Council Member Dan Garodnick will address a large number of questions about the project, where it stands and where it is going. Audience members will also be able to ask questions. We expect the discussion to last about an hour. I hope that everyone can attend.

District Manager's Report – Toni Carlina

So far this month we've held two development task force meetings. The first meeting was with NYU to review how the roadway surrounding the development of their properties will be used and how it will affect the community. In their haste to get the project done, they did not notify the neighbors of the disruptions that may occur due to their construction. At the meeting all parties were represented and all came to consensus. The second was an update on East Side Access project, the main topic was impact to the environment.

Constituents have indicated that every time there is a blast that particulate matter is released into the air and have raised concerns over air quality.

j. Community Board Request to the SLA that liquor licenses for Comical Corp Inc. D/B/A The New York Comedy Club, 241 East 24th St. between 2nd and 3rd Aves Be REVOKED and strongly oppose the renewal of their liquor licenses.

WHEREAS, the applicants did not appear at the meeting the Business Affairs & Street Activities Committee of CB6 on March 22nd to answer any concerns regarding the renewal of this license; and

WHEREAS, several community members appeared at this meeting to voice their strong opposition to the applicant's renewal; one woman went into detail that, as a long time resident situated across the street from the premises, she has the 'police precinct on speed dial' citing she must contend regularly with extreme noise from the street and crowds when the comedy club lines people up on the sidewalk and allows their patrons to loiter in front of the club before, during and after shows. She said this has been going on for years and the club has been entirely non-responsive in addressing neighbors concerns. She also explained that during cold weather patrons wait in vestibules of neighboring building leaving smoke and trash behind in addition to disturbing residents of the respective buildings; and

WHEREAS, there are at least nine ECB violations we are aware of in addition to numerous existing DOB violations (details to follow under separate cover); now

THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that pursuant to all of the above CB6M urges the State Liquor Authority to **REVOKE** the current license issued to the New York Comedy Club for the premises located at 241 East 24th Street at New York, NY currently The New York Comedy Club, and strongly opposes any renewal of this licenses.

WHEREAS, the 500 foot rule applies and therefore there is no way to determine whether this renewal is in the public interest; now
