



What is NYC Clean Heat?

In April of 2011, the New York City Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) issued regulations that require buildings to convert from highly-polluting heating oil to cleaner fuels. Since July 1, 2012, DEP no longer approves Certificates of Operation for No. 6 oil. As these permits must be renewed every three years, No. 6 oil will be completely eliminated by 2015. By 2030 (or when replacing boiler/burner – whichever happens sooner), buildings must convert to a fuel cleaner than No. 6 and No. 4.

As part of PlaNYC's goal to achieve the cleanest air of any large U.S. city, the City launched the NYC Clean Heat program to provide resources to building owners who are converting and to encourage conversions to the cleanest fuels before regulations mandate that buildings do so. Whether buildings need help understanding conversion options, coordinating with utilities, or assembling financing, NYC Clean Heat is available to provide assistance.
