


### NYC DOT will improve conditions along Columbus Avenue from West 96th St to West 77th St by:

- Installing a parking-protected bicycle path on the east side of the street to enhance safety and mobility; the existing curbside parking lane will be replaced with a floating (offset) parking lane.
  - **Phase I** (W96-W86 Sts.) implementation begins Aug. 16th
  - **Phase II** (W86-W77 Sts.) implementation begins Sept. 13th (following street resurfacing)
- Adding dedicated left-turn lanes at West 86th, West 81st and West 77th Streets, with separate bike and left-turn traffic signals. Installing left turn safety treatments at some intersections, replacing some metered parking spaces.
- Building concrete pedestrian refuge islands to shorten crossing distance and improve safety at approximately 28 intersections.
- Installing muni-meters between 86th and 96th Street.

Implementation starts mid-August 2010
