- a minor amendment (ULURP# M880002BZAM) to Special Permit (N880002ZAM) to locate the Museum's gift shop into a portion of the Covered Plaza, which is now occupied by the Museum; and**
- a modification of Special Permit (M880002 (A) ZAM) to permit an increase in the hours during which the Covered Plaza operates.**

**Re: Intro 249: Placing flyers on motor vehicles.**

**Full Board Vote: 26 In Favor 11 Against 1 Abstentions 0 Present**

**WHEREAS, Community Board 7/Manhattan has opposed unsolicited advertising leaflets or promotions left at doorsteps, in building hallways or attached to private or public property, and has supported the Department of Sanitation's efforts to remove promotional materials from public property and to prosecute the responsible individuals; and**

**WHEREAS, the problem also extends to unsolicited advertising flyers attached to private motor vehicles parked on local streets; and**

**WHEREAS, these flyers constitute unsolicited advertising and the individuals distributing them often damage the motor vehicles while inserting flyers under wipers, and the motor vehicles' owners are currently without recourse to collect for damages; and**

**WHEREAS, these flyers and promotions are usually discarded on the street, constituting a major source of street litter, and consequently, a public nuisance;**

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT Community Board 7/Manhattan supports the Department of Sanitation and encourages the City Council's Environmental Committee to release Intro 249 for a Council vote, as this legislation would permit the Department of Sanitation to enforce existing Administrative Law prohibiting**

**citizens from placing flyers on motor vehicles and also would allow the Department to prosecute the person(s), business or organization named on the flyer.**
