

What should you shred?

- Bank statements that are at least one year old and do not contain tax-related information
- Pay stubs (only after you receive your Form W-2)
- Credit card applications
- Any other documents that contain your Social Security Number, account numbers, password/PIN information, your birth date, private contact information, and signature

Always remember to shred documents that contain personal identifying information before throwing them away.
