New York City is the only major US city without a wildlife rehabilitation facility. The Wild Bird Fund will change all that on **Saturday June 2 and Sunday June 3, 2012,** when we open our new Wildlife Rehabilitation and Education Center to the public. We invite you to see our beautiful landmark storefront at 565 Columbus Avenue (between 87th and 88th Streets) from 10 AM to 6 PM.

Licensed wildlife rehabilitators will give lectures and demonstrations featuring live birds and animals. Children will enjoy animal arts and crafts and the opportunity to meet some of our wild babies.

WHY NYC NEEDS A WILDLIFE CENTER

Over 350 species of birds either live here or fly through on migration. 90% of the injuries our patients suffer are caused by human activities. The WBF provides emergency care for over 1,000 wild birds and animals each year. With the new Center we plan to double our capacity.

The WBF takes in distressed wildlife from Central Park Conservancy, New York City Audubon, NYPD, Mayor's Alliance for Animals, Urban Park Rangers, Animal Care & Control, and thousands of caring New Yorkers.
