Plan 2045 – the Next Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) for the New York Metropolitan Transportation Council (NYMTC)

Who we are?

- A “metropolitan planning organization”
 - A regional council of governments
 - Nine voting & seven advisory members
- Required by Federal transportation legislation which authorizes funding for transportation
 - Responsible for the mandated metropolitan transportation planning process


Our Planning Area



What is the Regional Transportation Plan?

- Is a federally-required planning product
- Is THE basis for federal transportation funding in the NYMTC planning area
- Covers a minimum 20-year timeframe
- Is a blueprint that helps guide funding of investments in the NYMTC planning area
- Is based on Council members’ vision for the region enshrined in the goals & outcomes outlined in the Plan
- Is multi-modal
- Is fiscally-constrained (needs cannot outweigh resources)
- Is developed collaboratively with members, agencies, other stakeholders and you the public

Some Fast Facts on the NYMTC Planning Area

- Regional population of over 12 million
- Over 19,000 lane miles of interstates, freeways, parkways, expressways, arterial and collector roadways
- Over 2,400 roadway bridges
- Nearly 480 route miles of commuter rail and 225 route miles of subway tracks
- Over 176 million vehicle miles traveled on the region’s roadway
- Over 850 miles of on-road bike facilities
- Over 9.5 million transit riders daily

- New federal requirements & priorities
- Technological developments


Your Input is needed
